Health industry experts say there are 11 million U.S. citizens who are eligible for Medicaid or SCHIP, but are not enrolled.

It begs the question: Why is Congress crafting plans to spend billions of taxpayer dollars to design new government programs when people aren't enrolled in the ones they've already created? As a member of the New Jersey Association of Health Underwriters, I urge Congress to find ways to sign up low-income citizens in existing programs before we design a new layer of government bureaucracy at great expense.

Once we've maximized the potential of the current programs, then we can identify the gaps, focusing on cutting health care costs through a combination of tort reform, creation of electronic medical records and preventive care, among other cost-effective solutions.
