When it comes to politics, the best sign that you've got it right is when you're being attacked from both sides.

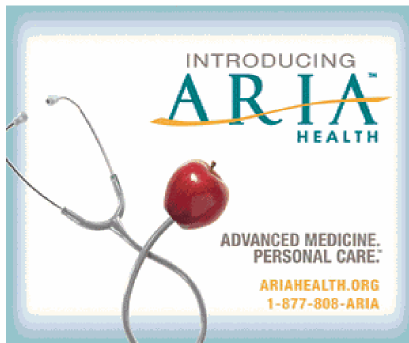
The long-awaited bill from the Senate Finance Committee, chaired by Sen. Max Baucus (D-Mont.) is drawing criticism from Democrats and Republicans alike, signaling that he may be onto something.

More than 500 amendments to the "Baucus bill" are being considered in the Senate, some of which attempt to pull the legislation in one direction or another - others which are clearly aimed at signing it.

As a member of the New Jersey Association of Health Underwriters, I commend President Obama for saying he will not sign a bill that will increase the deficit.

The Baucus bill currently stays within those lines, according to the Congressional Budget Office. But adding a public plan will drive up the cost of the bill to the point where it will no longer be revenue neutral.

As the public plan dictates what it will pay doctors and hospitals - just like Medicare and Medicaid - lost revenue will be shifted onto private plan ratepayers.

For these reasons, the Baucus bill does not contain a public plan. I would urge lawmakers to refrain from adding one.
