- 2 Current Legislative Environment
  - The "Know Your Doctor Bill" was signed into law yesterday, the measure (S-571/A-915), the "New Jersey Health Care Consumer Information Act," will require the state Division of Consumer Affairs to maintain informational files on all physicians and podiatrists in New Jersey. The agency will be required to make the "doctors' profiles" available to the public via the Internet and a toll-free telephone number.
  - The Mandate Commission Bill passed both houses. We have been strong supporters of this bill. The bill now goes to the Governor for his action.
  - 
  - Sen. Vitale and Coniglio have introduced a bill regulating Long Term Care based on the model NAIC bill. We support this bill.
  - A bill before the Senate, S-2275, that will create a 17 member commission to review and make recommendations on mandates has cleared the Senate Health Committee on Monday May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2003.
